Dig Deeper into Genesis 1:26-31 for lifegroups/personal study ...



Having reread the passage, you might like to pick a few of these questions to discuss.

- 1. How do these verses explain what it means for us to be in the image of God? How do they cause you to view yourself or those around you differently?
- 2. What should be the implications for us that we are made in the image of a "Worker God"? How might that affect your week (whether employee, volunteer, working at home or retired)?
- 3. Which verses speak to our care of creation? Can you suggest a few ways in which we can care for our God given environment (you might like to think in the categories Charlie mentioned of the macro, medium and micro scale)?
- 4. [If you have time and technology: Have a look at what the brilliant David Attenborough says in this <u>90 second video</u> related to the upcoming COP26 climate change conference (longer 8 min video is <u>here</u>). What reflections do you have, looking through the lens of Genesis 1?]
